Citizen Diplomacy and the Portsmouth Peace Treaty

A presentation by Charles Doleac

Thursday, September 23 at 3:00-7:00pm Carey Cottage Music Room

Attorney Charles B. Doleac, founder and chair of the Portsmouth Peace Treaty Forum, will present a program describing President Theodore Roosevelt's multi-track diplomacy that included the Russian and Japanese delegations, the US Navy and the New Hampshire citizens who hosted the thirty days of negotiations that resulted in the Portsmouth Peace Treaty. Theodore Roosevelt received the Nobel Peace Prize in 1906 – 115 years ago – for orchestrating the negotiations that ended what historians now call "World War Zero," the Russo-Japanese War.



We will gather informally on the Carey Cottage porch prior to the presentation, followed by the presentation at 4:00 in the Music Room. A reception on the Carey Cottage porch will follow. This is a members-only event.

Get Connected: Tree Care Professionals

As we head into hurricane season in earnest, it's always helpful to know who you will call in the event you have storm damage to the trees on your property. If you are worried about overhanging or dead limbs, now is a good time to have them taken care of.

Be part of our Storm Response Team of volunteers. If a significant storm is predicted, our Storm Response Team volunteers assist members who've asked for help preparing with tasks such as putting away outside furniture, moving flower pots, and performing other basic safety checks.

During storms, our Storm Response Team makes calls to check on members who've asked for check-ins and will return to help reinstall patio furniture and the like once the storm danger has passed.
